SCENIC AND CULTURAL ATTRACTIONS

- 1 **Timm's Hill County Park** – Highest geographical point in Wisconsin (1951.5 feet), observation tower, Ogema
- 2 **Wisconsin Concrete County Park** – Concrete sculptures by folk artist Fred Smith, Phillips
- 3 **Old Town Hall Museum** – Exhibits include logging tools, railroad memorabilia, one room school, Fifield
- 4 **Smith Rapids Covered Bridge** – Town Lattice style covered bridge, Fifield
- 5 **Big Falls County Park & Campground** – Scenic area on the Jump River, Kennan
- 6 **Solberg Lake County Park & Campground** – Multi-use recreational area, Phillips
- 7 **Round Lake Logging Dam** – Restored 1878 logging dam, Fifield
- 8 **Lidice Monument** – WW II Memorial, Sokol Park, Phillips
- 9 **VFW War Memorial Plane** – T-33 Fighter Plane, Prentice
- 10 **Veteran's Memorial Eagle "Old Abe"** – Mascot of the WI 8th Civil War Infantry and veteran's park, Park Falls
- 11 **Pine Line Rail Trail** – Multi-use recreational trail, Prentice
- 12 **Flambeau River Paper Co. Office Building** – National Register of Historic Places, downtown Park Falls
- 13 **Prentice History Walk** – Historical markers commemorate important events in the town's history, Prentice
- 14 **Fifield Post Office** – National Register of Historic Places, downtown Fifield
- 15 **Park Falls Post Office** – National Register of Historic Places, downtown Park Falls; John Watrous river drive mural
- 16 **Prentice Co-op Creamery Co.** – National Register of Historic Places, 1319 Town Street, Prentice
- 17 **Fifield Fire Tower** – National Register of Historic Places, Wintergreen Trailhead, Fifield
- 18 **Little Falls/Slough Gundy** – Scenic area on the Flambeau River, Flambeau River State Forest
- 19 **Knox House** – Original Finnish log home built in 1898 by Matt Johnson, Brantwood
- 20 **Finnish Immigrant Monument** – Dedicated in 1990 to Finnish immigrants, Brantwood
- 21 **Knox Creek Heritage Center** – Artifacts and documents representing several immigrant groups, Brantwood
- 22 **Tussockia State Trail** – Multi-use recreational trail, Park Falls
- 23 **Smith Lake County Park & Campground** – Multi-use recreational area, Park Falls
- 24 **Jump River Valley Historical Museum** – Displays tell the story of Price County from its origin in 1879, Catawba
- 25 **Price County Fairgrounds** – Home of the Price County Fair and other events, Phillips
- 26 **Memorial Grove Hemlocks** – Old-growth Hemlock Forest and Natural Area, Fifield
- 27 **Yesterday House & Liberty School** – 1886 Log House and Historic School, Spirit

AUTO, MOTORCYCLE & ON-ROAD BICYCLE TOURS

Price County has a variety of roads that are well suited for auto, motorcycle or tour biking. Most of Price County's secondary roads are lightly traveled by motor vehicles and are very scenic.

WISCONSIN CONCRETE PARK TOUR – Phillips / Pine Line - Prentice (27 miles round trip): Take County A north out of Prentice. Turn right on County K and travel north. Turn left on Little Chicago Rd to Hwy 13. Ride north about 2.5 miles to the Wisconsin Concrete Park where you can rest and enjoy the unique artwork of Fred Smith. A half mile north, Phillips offers a full host of services and attractions. After your visit, head south on Hwy 13 and turn left on County D, then right on County K, left on County A then cross Hwy 8 and travel into downtown Prentice, where the trailhead for the Price-Taylor Rail Trail, the Pine Line, is nearby. Enjoy the services and wide variety of picnic areas available throughout Prentice.

CRANBERRY MARSH & HISTORIC SITES TOUR – Fifield (60 miles round trip): Begin at Movrich Park located along the South Fork of the Flambeau River in downtown Fifield just south of Hwy 70 on Willow Ave. After leaving the park, take Hwy 70 about one mile east and turn south (right) on Hicks Landing Road, drive about two miles then turn left on Cranberry Marsh Dr. (gravel road) to view the marsh. Continue to Hwy 70, turn right driving east, then just past the Wintergreen Trail Parking area look to the north (left) and you will see the historic Fifield Fire Tower. Continue to Forest Rd 148/Smith Rapids Rd/Rustic Road #105 (gravel) where you turn north (left) to the Smith Rapids Covered Bridge. Continue north and then turn east (right) on Forest Rd 144 (gravel), traveling through the scenic beauty of the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest where you will find the Round Lake Logging Dam. Continue south on Forest Rd 144 to Hwy 70, then turn west (right) and return to Fifield where you can visit the Old Town Hall Museum, Greenfield School, and the Fifield Post Office which is on the National Register of Historic Places.

HOBBLES CREEK TOUR – Ogema / Catawba (18 miles one way): Begin this tour at Pioneer Park in downtown Ogema located just off Hwy 86 on Holmes Street. Head west on Hwy 86, cross Hwy 13 and continue on County O for eight miles to Hobbles Creek Road, continue to County I which goes north (right) to Catawba. There are grocery, hardware and convenience services there. You can extend your tour by backtracking south on County I one-half mile, then west (right) onto Midway Road until you reach County N in Kennan, Gateway to Big Falls County Park.

BIG FALLS TOUR – Kennan (10 miles one way): Start the ride at Memorial Park in Kennan located on County N about a mile south of Hwy 8. Continue south on County N through rolling farmland until you reach the intersection of Big Falls Road. Turn right and drive a short distance to Big Falls County Park. Hike the trail to view the water cascading around huge granite boulders on the Jump River.

TIMM'S HILL TOUR – Prentice/Ogema (25 miles round trip): Start your trip in the village of Prentice. Follow County C south past the intersection with Hwy 86 for a breathtaking view of Timm's Hill. You can access the county park via County RR, Rustic Road 62, where you can climb a 55' observation tower. Back track to Hwy 86, turning left towards Ogema where bikers can catch the Pine Line Rail Trail going north to Prentice and autos return on Hwy 13 or stay on County C after leaving the park and retrace your route back to Prentice for food & lodging.

MUSSER FLOWAGE TOUR – Phillips (25 miles round trip): Starting at the Wisconsin Concrete Park just south of Phillips, travel north 1/2 mile on Hwy 13 and turn east (right) on County D which will take you through farm and forest land. A restored schoolhouse/bed and breakfast is located along this stretch of roadway. Turn north at the intersection of County H and proceed to Musser Drive. Turn west onto Musser Drive and enjoy the view of the Musser Flowage area. Continue until you again reach County H. Turn left and follow County H along the Elk River into Phillips. Phillips provides full food, lodging and supply services.

SOO LAKE TOUR – Phillips (24 miles round trip): From downtown Phillips go west on Flambeau Avenue/County Road W and travel through the scenic Phillips Chain of Lakes region. You will also pass Soo Lake, then turn right onto County S and continue around the lake north and east. At the intersection of County F, turn right and continue into Phillips, now viewing the Phillips Chain of Lakes from the opposite side.

SOLBERG LAKE TOUR – Phillips (20 miles round trip): Leave Phillips on County H east to Solberg Lake Road. Follow the road around the lake until you see the Solberg Lake County Park sign. This park is an all-purpose recreation area including a sand beach, picnic area, campground, boat landing, fishing pier, and nature trail. After leaving the park, turn left onto Solberg Lake Road and continue around the lake until you come to a "T" intersection at Old 13 Road. Turn left and return to Phillips.

RUSTIC ROAD #62 TOUR – Ogema / Spirit (20 miles round trip): This trip begins by heading east on Highway 86 out of Ogema on rolling hills. Turn south on County C to County RR, Rustic Road 62. The park at Timm's Hill has an observation tower for a picturesque vista of the countryside surrounding the highest point in Wisconsin. Return to County C and go south (left), then east (left) on County YY and Hwy. 102 continuing east and then north (left). At Hwy 86 in Spirit go west (left) and return to Ogema.

FLAMBEAU RIVER TOUR – Park Falls / Oxbow (40 miles round trip): Begin the tour at Tussockia Trailhead County Park, go south on Park Lane, then west (right) on County E, then south (left) on County B to Highway 70. Ride west on Highway 70 along the beautiful North Fork of the Flambeau River. Rest at the wayside at Oxbow and enjoy the river. Continue west until the intersection of Highway EE. Turn right and head back to Park Falls for a wide variety of services for the traveler.

RIVER ROAD TOUR – Park Falls / Turtle-Flambeau Flowage (32 miles round trip): Begin the tour at Preisler Park and head north on Third Ave N., then east on 2nd St. N., then north on 1st Ave N./Agenda Road, then east (right) on North River Road. Enjoy the scenic tour along the banks of the Flambeau River. Turn right onto Creamery Road and follow it to the intersection of County F. Turn right and continue to County FF in Iron County. The Flowage is about two miles past the county line. The Turtle-Flambeau Flowage is the Crown Jewel of the North, resembling the Boundary Waters region of Minnesota and Canada. Retrace your route back to Park Falls.

LAND AND WATER TRAILS

- MOUNTAIN BIKE**
There are several silent sports and hunter walking trails in Price County that offer excellent off-road bicycling opportunities. These trails are closed to motorized vehicles. In addition, there are hundreds of miles of logging roads in the Price County Forest and the Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest. In southeastern Price County, the Timm's Hill National Scenic Trail offers some challenging bike riding as it winds its way south to the Ice Age Trail. See the map for locations of the silent sports and hunter walking trails in Price County.
- HIKING**
Experience the solitude of Price County through the many miles of hiking trails offered. The numerous trails offer opportunities for a short hike or a chance to enjoy lengthier backpacking trips. From the Wintergreen Trailhead just east of Fifield, take a short uphill hike to view the historic Fifield Fire Tower. Just east of Ogema you will find the High Point Trails at Timm's Hill County Park. Timm's Hill is Wisconsin's highest geographical point.
- CANOE & KAYAK**
The North and South Forks of the Flambeau River offer excellent canoeing for all . . . novice to expert. Scenic beauty, good fishing, wildlife and adventure are awaiting you on the river. With moderate paddling, it is easy to average three or four miles per hour. Many campsites are available along the North Fork for longer trips. - ATV/UTV AND OFF-ROAD MOTORCYCLE**
Flambeau Trail System - Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest - East of Park Falls - 70 miles
Solberg Trail - Northeast of Phillips - 9.5 miles
Tussockia State Trail - West of Park Falls - 62 miles (Off-road motorcycles are not allowed)
Georgetown Trail - Price County Forest - West of Phillips - 16 miles
Pine Line Rail Trail - Winter use only - trailheads in Prentice and Medford - 26 miles (Off-road motorcycles are not allowed)
Flambeau River State Forest Trail - West of Phillips - 38 miles (Off-road motorcycles are not allowed)
Dead Horse Run Trail - Chequamegon-Nicolet National Forest - West of Park Falls - 56 miles

PRICE COUNTY AREA HUNTER WALKING TRAILS

Maintained and managed by the Price County Forestry & Parks Department, U.S. Forest Service and the Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources, these trails are generally well maintained and mowed regularly to ensure high-quality game food can continue to flourish. Many wildlife openings are also maintained along these trails. These trails are gated to vehicular traffic. The trails are also used for snowmobiling, hiking, biking, horseback riding, cross-country skiing and snowshoeing. In addition, there are 100's of miles of logging access trails which provide great hunting and recreation opportunities.
