HOUSEHOLD & HAZARDOUS WASTE COLLECTION

Household hazardous waste will be accepted at the above locations and times. Hazardous household waste includes: **oil-based paints**, solvents, pesticides, hazardous cleaners, rechargeable ni-cad, metal halide and button batteries, corrosives, flammables, mercury, old gas, antifreeze, and cell phones. A small fee is required for fluorescent and high-density light bulbs, oil filters, and some electronics. ****See reverse side for list of accepted items and fees****

Note: Latex paint, alkaline batteries and tires will not be accepted

ELECTRONICS COLLECTION

THE FOLLOWING ELECTRONIC ITEMS WILL BE ACCEPTED AT THE COLLECTION EVENTS BY Alter Metal Recycling.

Electronics accepted at NO CHARGE include:

- Appliances: washers, dryers, dishwashers, microwaves, water heaters, furnaces
- Computers: CPUs(no laptops or monitors), mouse, keyboards, and cables
- Electronics: desktop printers/copiers (with no ink cartridges), game consoles, typewriters
- Lead Acid Batteries: Car batteries, deep cycle, etc

Pricing for disposal of other electronic items:

- Refrigerators, freezers, a/c units, dehumidifiers
and other Freon containing electronics. \$25 each

We will NOT accept Ammonia refrigeration units, Monitors, Televisions, Ink or toner Cartridges, PCB Ballast, Mercury or Capacitors.

Many products you use in your home and yard contain hazardous materials. Improper disposal of these products can cause fires, injuries to people and animals, and groundwater contamination. This guide will help you identify hazardous products in your home. Keep your home safe by disposing of hazardous products properly.

- **DO NOT DUMP** leftover products in the backyard or down the storm sewer.
- **DO NOT BURN** leftover products.
- **DO NOT BURY** leftover products.
- **DO NOT REUSE** pesticide or other chemical containers for other purposes.
- **DO NOT MIX** chemical wastes.

BUSINESS COLLECTION PROGRAM

Materials will be accepted from businesses for a reasonable fee. Please call 715-635-2197 ahead of time to make arrangements for large deliveries.

FEE ITEMS

The following items will be accepted at the collection at the following prices:

- **65¢/85¢** per 4' or less/ >4' tube
- **\$1.75/\$2.25** per 4' or less Shatter Shield tube/ >4' tube
- **\$2.50** per H.I.D. light bulb*
- **\$2.00** per tanning bed bulb
- **\$1.00** per oil filter
- **65¢** per circular light tube

*Includes high pressure sodium, metal halide, and mercury vapor lamps

UNACCEPTABLE ITEMS

Cleansweep will not accept:

- Ammunition
- Asbestos
- Alkaline Batteries
- Biological/Infectious Waste
- Compressed Gas Cylinders
- Explosives
- Empty Paint Cans
- Freon 11 + 12
- **Latex Paint**
- Needles
- Radioactive materials
- Recyclables
- TV's & Monitors

AGRICULTURAL PROGRAM

Northwest Cleansweep will be able to accept chemicals from farmers, abandoned farms and businesses with agricultural related wastes at any of the household hazardous waste collection events or at the permanent collection site in Spooner.

PROPER DISPOSAL OF MERCURY WASTE

Simple household items can contain heavy metals and mercury that can contaminate rivers, lakes and fish if not properly disposed of. Bring the following items from your home to one of our household hazardous waste collections so they can be recycled or managed properly:

- Mercury batteries
- Button batteries
- Thermostats and switches
- Fluorescent and HID lamps (fee)
- Some types of old paint
- Liquid mercury
- Thermometers
